In-Person Worship Survey Results

From Dr. Michael Roberts, Senior Pastor:

Grace and Peace to all as we navigate a new reality in the midst of a pandemic. I will get to the survey results soon, but first I want to share some theological context. As United Methodists we follow "Three Simple Rules" – Do no harm, Do good, and Attend to the Ordinances of God. These rules are actually a part of our doctrine.

Do no harm! For a pandemic version of this rule, we could add expectations around wearing face coverings, practicing physical distancing, and washing hands. Doing these "three simple things," as one article put it, would make live out our faith. a big difference. Do good! Goodness flows from the virtues of holiness – patience, kindness, humility, along with finding ways to lift up others (See Eph 4:1-3). We all need more of that. These first two rules are empowered by the third – by being intentional about worship, prayer, reading scripture, gathering for holy conversation, and other "ordinances" that ground us in faith and



give us the spiritual resources we need to live out our faith.

These rules motivated the survey that was shared last week and will continue to motivate our response. The full reports from Google Forms are available through links on our website at www.conwayfumc.org and in email communications, if you are interested in more than a brief summary.

A total of 230 people (and/or families) responded. A little over 80 per-

cent stated clearly that they would not be comfortable returning to "in-person" worship at this time. We had previously talked about Back-to-School Sunday as a possibility for a relaunch of some kind. Seventy-three percent believe that this is not the time to consider that and that we should focus on online experiences and/ or consider options that do not involve large-group gatherings indoors. For the next few questions, the vast majority (98%+) would wear face coverings, avoid physical contact, and practice physical distancing, and thus both "do no harm" and "do good." Eighty-five percent and up believe the church should require these things as well, if we were to gather in-person. Concerning comfort with children being present and involved in activities, the results were mixed with 24 percent comfortable with children being present in worship only and 30 percent comfortable with children in classes and nursery with precautions in place – if we were to return to in -person worship at this time. Ninety per-





cent have participated in and enjoyed online worship. Through the survey we also got a good sense of other ministries and online opportunities in which people have participated.

For some conclusions, after discussions with our relaunch team and our board of trustees, we will continue to focus on online experiences and continue our efforts to improve our offerings, especially from a technical standpoint. We have a goal of being a church where people turn for a quality and inspiring online experience. While we will continue to plan for a relaunch of in-person worship, there is no date in mind at this point. Under our current stage, as set by the Arkansas Conference, we can have smaller gatherings at the church – with procedures and policies in place - masks, distancing, etc. We are developing protocols which will be shared soon. We will move slowly with our three simple rules in mind.
