Ingathering for Those Displaced by Tornadoes, Hurricanes and War

The United Women of Faith (formerly United Methodist Women) is sponsoring an ingathering of Hygiene Kits and Hygiene Kit items for the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) during the summer months of June and July.

In addition to helping locally with hunger, the homeless and those in need, sometimes we also need to reach out to those beyond our neighborhoods to those suffering from disasters. This ingathering of Hygiene Kits comes at a time when many in our country have been displaced and have lost their homes to recent hurricanes and tornadoes. In addition to this, there are thousands who have been displaced by war, notably Ukranians.

Hygiene Kit Materials

- One hand towel (15 x 25 –17 x 27 inches) No kitchen, cleaning, or microfiber towels
- One washcloth
 No kitchen, cleaning, or microfiber towels
- · One comb

Must be sturdy with at least 6 inches of teeth No pocket combs or picks

Rattail and combs without handles are acceptable but must

have at least 6 inches of teeth

One toenail or fingernail clipper
 No emery boards or metal nail files

As a connectional church, we have the opportunity and obligation to reach out and help those in need. UMCOR states that these Hygiene Kits are "providing basic necessities to people who have been forced to leave their homes because of human conflict or natural disaster."

Listed below are the items in each hygiene kit. One kit costs around \$12 to buy and put together. If you like, pick one or two items and just bring those to the church and they will be added with other donated items to make up kits. Look for the marked containers in the church entrance areas where kits and kit items can be dropped off.



- Bath-size soap (3 oz. bar or larger) No Ivory or Jergen's soap Do not remove from packaging
- One adult toothbrush Do not remove from packaging Personal advertising not acceptable
- 10 adhesive bandages (3/4 by 3 inches) Common household bandages acceptable
- One one-gallon size re-sealable bag



Favorite memory: I really enjoyed my first lock-in several years ago, in part because of all the welcoming and friendly people that make up the community here.




Kathleen Johnson is planning to attend the University of Arkansas.
