Blessing of the Animals Set Oct. 2

Our annual Blessing of the Animals will be held from 3 to 4 p.m. Sunday, Oct. 2, in the parking lot at Conway First United Methodist Church, weather permitting.

Activities will begin with a short worship service led by our Children's Choirs. The service will include reciting the Blessing of St. Francis of Assisi, known as the Patron Saint of Animals.

In addition to options for pets and families to park and walk up for a blessing, we will also have a drive-through, in-vehicle option for pets with "social anxiety." Pets must be leashed or crated.

Pets will be blessed as a special creation of God. Even if you don't have a pet, you are welcome to attend and enjoy. If your pet can't make it to the blessing, you are invited to bring a photo of him or her to be blessed. Children are also invited to bring their favorite stuffed animal for a blessing.

The Priesthood of All Believers

Serving God and Each Other through Sacred Music

On Sunday, Aug. 21, 2022, the Bishop of Mainz, Germany, Peter Kohlgraf, made this statement at the dedication of the new organ in the cathedral regarding the importance of sacred music:

"Describing the Magnitude and Beauty of God and simultaneously describing God's Magnitude and Essence of Mystery is the preachingduty of music in the Church, not only in the Liturgy."

Have you ever thought of music as an office of preaching in the Church? The congregational hymns we sing, the responses, introits, and anthems of the choir as sermons? As teaching moments? As ways to encounter Sacred Mystery? And have you ever considered the persons who study and prepare this musical sacrifice as priests or ministers?

Making music in the Church is a vital aspect of what we call the Priesthood of All Believers. We know we are all part of this, because we know that God told Moses on Sinai, who told us, that we, God's people, are also God's priests: "Although the whole earth is mine, you will be for me a kingdom of priests and a holy nation (Exodus 19)." This priesthood of all persons is confirmed again and again in the Old and New Testaments by the prophets, historical writers, by

the writers of the epistles, and the evangelists.

Not only is sacred music a preaching office, it is a teaching and worship-leading office. It is a means whereby we enter into Sacred Mystery and most especially a means whereby we all teach each other about God, as Bishop Kohlgraf put it: about God's Magnitude and Beauty.

Remember how Moses, in talking to God both in the burning bush and on Sinai, doubts himself, asking God "What do I say to the people"? We're all so much like Moses! "I can't do that. I can't sing. You don't want to hear me sing! I can't play instruments. What use would I be?"

The good news for Moses and the Israelites was that God knew better, and in God's Wisdom, God told Moses (and us!): "Here's what you say. Tell the Israelites this: I'll give you what you need. I'll equip you for service, for ministry. You are all priests of my Kin-dom." In the Tent of Meeting on Sinai God not only gives the Law, but God also foretells the Gospel with the call to ministry: service not only to God, but service to others, too.

There are many of us who stand on Sinai or at the burning bush, called but hesitant, interested, but reluctant. Be confident that God gives you what you need: if you love to sing, you will learn to sing even better. If you have convinced yourself you can't sing or play instruments but wish you could, you will learn how.

The Music Ministry of First United Methodist Church welcomes you to participate in its many musical preaching opportunities for all ages. We provide you the notes to sing, and God provides you the words to proclaim. And as an added benefit, in doing so, we enjoy the blessings of Christian fellowship and friendship.

Children, Youth, Adults, Parents, Singles, all you people on the journey: I invite you to become part of the Music Ministry.



A Tribute to Pastor Michael



A tenure of 10 years as senior pastor of a United Methodist Church is definitely on the long side of the norm. At Conway First United Methodist Church, Rev. Dr. Michael Roberts has definitely gone beyond the norm — both in years of service at the church and in his depth of ministry.

In August, Bishop Gary Mueller announced that Dr. Roberts had been appointed to be the Director of the Arkansas Conference ReStart Initiative, effective October 1.

Since July 2012, Pastor Michael has been the spiritual head of this congregation, leading us not only in worship but also in mission, ministry and education. Michael says his initial focus for Conway FUMC was on worship and Bible study, with work on new ministries mixed in. During his tenure, he worked to develop our MidYouth ministry, create new classes for all ages,

oversee building renovations and a capital campaign, and helping to design the new Love Grows Here vision.

"From 2012 to 2019, we experienced growth every year in worship attendance and ministry participation," he said.

This vision and its outcomes were all on track for great things when the pandemic hit in 2020. Using the word "pivot" became our byword — and Pastor Michael led the charge in determining how to do ministry in a different way. This included developing multiple online and hybrid opportunities.

"Today, as we come out of this challenging time, we are seeing renewed excitement for worshiping together and meeting together with many new people

who found us online and want to be in a congregation where love truly does grow here," he says. Half jokingly, he added, "I would have never imagined that I could tell people to not come to church for over a year and we would come through that so well."

For the past 10 years, Pastor Michael has not pastored alone. In fact, he has had some heavy-hitting associate pastors who did great things here and continue to do so in a variety of posts throughout Arkansas.

Rev. Lynn Kilbourne was already in place at Conway First United Methodist Church when Pastor Michael came on board. She served as an associate from July 2011 through June 2016. "One of the things I most enjoyed about working with Pastor Michael was the time we spent in conversation planning our sermons," she says. "We would spend time thinking of illustrations, ways to connect the scripture to the lives of the folks in the congregation, and how we could make a sermon actually mean something to the hearers. I miss those conversations!"

One example of this brought a national issue right here to the doors of Conway FUMC. "I remember when the Supreme Court made significant decisions by a five-to-four vote. Pastor Michael and I

wondered how we would address these subjects in our preaching. I'll never forget how he pointed out to me that Conway FUMC is a 'five to four' congregation; on any given issue, the congregation is likely split somewhere around five to four. Instead of that being a negative, Pastor Michael led the congregation to see that as a strength and challenged us all to find our unity in something deeper - the call to love as Christ loves us."

Rev. Lauren DeLano came on board, fresh out of Boston University School of Theology, in July 2016. She served until June 2020, when she was named senior pastor of Vilonia United Methodist Church. Her time as an associate with Pastor Michael seemed to be more like a team effort, with some humor mixed in. In fact, many times you could hear Michael say, "Yes, Lauren, you're right," only with Lauren to respond, "I know!"

Lauren says she particularly remembers the love she felt in her time at Conway FUMC. "When I found out I was being appointed to Conway First straight out of seminary, I cried tears of joy. In those moments, I was so excited to be somewhere familiar, a town I'd gone to college in, and to have some familiar faces in the congregation.

"I was also excited to work with Michael from our first phone call as we talked about how we might work together at Conway. From the very beginning of my time at Conway First, Michael was a mentor to me, but shortly into our time together we also became teammates. He didn't just see me as a young pastor straight out of seminary who had a few things to learn, he respected my perspective, my input, and my gifts for ministry. I will always be grateful to have spent my first four years in full-time ministry at Conway First working alongside Michael."

Rev. Michelle Moore came to Conway FUMC from a Conference position, right after the start of the pandemic. With her came the knowledge this congregation needed to launch those online and hybrid opportunities. And as quickly as she came in, she was out of here after serving just less than one full year, heading to northwest Arkansas to pastor her own church.

"The ministry partnership I had the privilege of experiencing with Michael will undoubtedly be the most memorable I will ever have. At least I hope that is the case! We got the unique experience of navigating an entire year of pandemic together, when all the rules for how things were 'supposed' to work went right out the window! As a result, we got to go on some amazing adventures together," Michelle said.

These adventures included "such holy moments as standing outside live-streaming and presiding over memorials, and such wild adventures as hauling camera equipment up trails on Petit Jean Mountain. Still, it will be the quieter times, sitting together in the sanctuary and reflecting on what our baptisms and our ordinations mean in such seasons, or the hilarious times of laughing over video bloopers, that I will hold closest in my heart. I am grateful for Michael's warm and open heart for people and our Methodist Church

and so thankful to have had him to walk through that wild and wooly season alongside."

While we hate to see him go, Michael has a big job ahead of him, stepping into a newly created cabinet position to provide spiritual care, support, worship opportunities, and the development of next steps for persons who will remain United Methodists from congregations involved in the disaffiliation process.

As for the Conway First congregation, Pastor Michael is known as a people person. "I've always known that what Michael really and truly cares about is PEOPLE," said congregant Wayne Gregory, who has served on many committees with Michael. "Even though he is forced to deal with denominational issues, church finances, non-working air conditioning, leaky roofs, Covid closures, and a hundred other things that try to get between him and other people, he always comes back to caring about people. And this includes people who may be on the other side of some of those issues."

In making the appointment announcement, Bishop Gary Mueller said: "I am delighted that Dr. Roberts has agreed to serve as the first Director of the Arkansas ReStart Initiative. Michael is passionate about the future of the church. He brings in-depth knowledge and experience after his years with Connected in Christ and service as Senior Pastor at Conway First United Methodist Church. He is a perfect match for this position at this time. I am grateful for the opportunity to work with Michael, thankful for his willingness to serve, and excited about the work he will do in a position that."

In the meantime, we are happy to have Rev. Dede Roberts serving as interim Senior Pastor. FUMC will continue to be the church home for the Roberts family in the immediate future, the family said.

1610 Investment Plan: Invest in Our C1Youth

We are asking that you consider investing in our C1Youth ministry by investing \$16.10 per month for one year beginning Oct. 15, for a total of \$193.20. We will use all the investments to send each youth to three conference events — Refuge, Veritas, and Assembly — our own spring retreat ReConnect, and one summer mission trip for FREE!!

We are praying we reach the 250 investments that it will take to accomplish that goal this year. Last year the 1610 investment plan sent 29 youth and adults to Junior High Refuge, 46 youth and adults to Veritas, 55 youth and adults to ReConnect, 53 youth and adults on mission trips, and 35 youth and adults to Assembly.

The 1610 Investment Plan continues to be a success. Not only have stories been created from the trips that have had their costs covered by the investments made, but we have 11 youth in discernment of their calling into ministry — both lay and ordained — and what that looks like for each of them. Each and every youth in discernment has expressed that these trips were instrumental in their decisions to seek

out their calling. It's not just an investment in the youth ministry, it's an investment in the stories created in youth ministry by creating space for God to do what God does.

More specifics about the program:

- This investment is for 8th 12th graders only
- This is a commitment ABOVE AND BEYOND the pledges made to stewardship and Blessings to Blessings.
- The entire investment is tax deductible.
- We can easily add to an existing automatic draft if it's set up through the church already or set up a new draft.
- If you have been investing by direct draft over this last year then you are all set, unless you would like to make any changes.
- You can make monthly payments or pay in one lump sum by check. The cost is \$193.20 for one, \$386.40 for two, or \$579.60 for three. You can write a check to Conway FUMC and attach it to the investment form or write in the memo line "1610 plan" and place it in the offering plate.
